CME PROGRAM FOCUSES ON ALZHEIMER'S & DEMENTIA

Aging and Alzheimer's

On Sept. 4, members of the Boone County Medical Society met at Provision Living-Columbia, where CME presentations focused on Alzheimer's disease and dementia. Speakers included Gregory Day, MD, Assistant Professor of Neurology at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis (pictured top left), and Adrienne Holden from the Greater Missouri Chapter of Alzheimer's Association (pictured lower right). Staff from Provision Living, including Community Resource Manager Denise Falco, then led attendees through virtual dementia training. The training required participants to wear special footwear, headphones and glasses, all designed to demonstrate how people with dementia and Alzheimer's see the world around them and function when facing everyday tasks (photos on next page).



Alzheimer's disease facts

- Alzheimer's is the 6th leading cause of death in people ages 65 years old and older.
- Unlike other major diseases, which caused fewer deaths in 2008 than in 2000, Alzheimer's deaths rose by 66 percent.

Caregiver's burden and scope

- In 2016, 15.9 million family and other unpaid caregivers (in the U.S.) provided nearly 18.2 billion hours of care to people with Alzheimer's and other dementias.
- Alzheimer's is the third most expensive disease among older adults, after heart disease and cancer.

Fraunfelder Appointed to Assistant Dean's Position

BCMS President Frederick W. Fraunfelder, MD, MBA, was appointed assistant dean for faculty affairs at the MU School of Medicine, effective Sept. 1, 2018.

Fraunfelder has served as chair of the Department of Ophthalmology and director of the Mason Eye Institute since 2014. He will continue in these roles as he helps in a variety of areas including faculty development and leadership trainings for our medical school faculty. He will work alongside Michael Misfeldt, PhD, senior associate dean for faculty affairs.

In addition to his expertise in corneal disease, Fraunfelder is a nationally recognized expert in the ocular side effects of drugs. His research focuses on the effects of cryotherapy on ocular tumors. He has published more than 100 peer-reviewed articles, served as an author of four books and has written more than 30 book chapters, with many of these publications dealing with ocular toxicology.

Fraunfelder serves as the director of the National Registry of Drug-Induced Ocular Side Effects. Fraunfelder also serves on the board of directors for the Saving Sight eye bank.

Fraunfelder received his medical degree from Oregon Health & Science University in Portland, Oregon. He completed his ophthalmology residency at the University of Washington Medical Center and completed a fellowship in corneal disease at OHSU. He also received a Master of Business Administration degree in health care management from OHSU.

BCMS Memberships, 2019 Dues Schedule

BCMS is a component society of MSMA, therefore, you must belong to MSMA in order to be a BCMS member. Find MSMA's dues schedule online at www.msma.org.

Active: Limited to those MSMA and BCMS dues-paying members who hold a license to practice as a physician or surgeon under the laws of the State of Missouri.

Honor: Active members who have reached advanced years, retired or become incapacitated and are unable to continue their active practice of medicine.

Honorary: Individuals (do not have to be physicians) who have distinguished themselves by special investigational work or personal sacrifice in the cause of medicine.

Resident: Members of the Resident and Fellow Section who are serving a full-time postgraduate training program approved by the AMA or the AOA.

Student: Reside in Boone, Howard or Cooper counties; limited to members of the medical student section who are pursuing a course of study leading to the degree of Doctor of Medicine or Doctor of Osteopathy.

Associate: Health-related professionals not provided for in other categories of membership who wish to become members of BCMS. They also must join MSMA in order to be eligible for BCMS membership.
